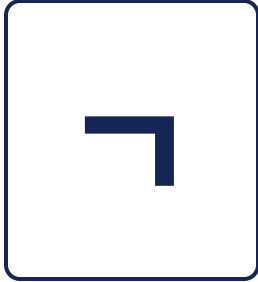


# Korean Alphabet ㄱ Worksheet

Sound, stroke order, syllable blocks, and first words

Beginner Hangul



**Sound / Use:** A light g/k sound. It can sound closer to g between vowels and closer to k at the beginning or end.

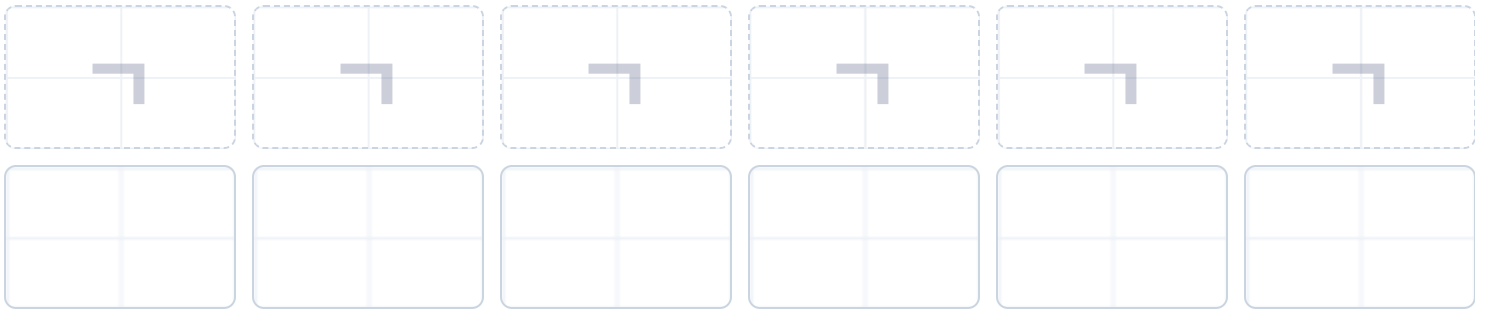
**Teacher note:** English speakers often push too much air into ㄱ. Keep it lighter than English k.

**Study order:** Read aloud, trace slowly, write independently, then check spacing and sound.

## 1. Stroke or Pattern Steps

1. Start at the top-left and draw a short line to the right.
2. Turn down and draw the vertical line.
3. Keep the corner clean, not rounded.
